

Your Board of Selectmen has made a major commitment to improve and enhance the Town's infrastructure.

In the past year we have continued to:

- Improve our roads
- Provide additional staff to assist in maintaining:
  - Athletic fields
  - Town green areas
  - The Farmington Valley Trail
- In the Town Hall we have replaced windows, gutters, carpeting and renovated restrooms
- The Town gazebo and pool house have been upgraded with the help of volunteers from the Canton Lions and Cherry Brook Garden Club

Moving forward you will see:

- · Construction of the new track and multipurpose field
- Improvements to the driveway and parking lot at the High School
- Major repairs and updates to the Mills Pond pool will be undertaken prior to the start of next season
- Roof replacement will start at the Community Center/Library and all three schools

In addition it is anticipated that the Board will seek approval in the spring for bonding to fund major improvements to our roads as part of the pavement management program. Town officials will continue to look for options regarding relocation of the Town's highway garage and if an appropriate site can be located, include the cost on the next bonding referendum. Add to those projects the possibility to obtain grants and state aid to finalize the permits and design of the Collinsville hydro project and development of a Canton Main Street Program for Collinsville and 2013 should be a busy and exciting year.



# **ELDERLY TAX RELIEF**

Reminder: The filing period for the Elderly / Disabled Homeowners Tax Relief program begins February 1, 2013 and continues until May 15, 2013. Homeowners may be eligible for up to \$3,250 for a married couple, or \$3,000 for an individual, in property tax relief. To be eligible you have to be 65 or older or totally disabled on 12/31/2012 and your adjusted gross income, plus social security, has to be \$40,900 or less and you owned your own home on October 1, 2012. ## TOWN DEPARTMENTS

#### **TOWN CLERK**

Transfer Station stickers for 2013 are available at the Town Clerk's office. All residents MUST present a copy of their vehicle's REGISTRATION for each car in need of a sticker. The fee is \$150 for the first car and \$1 for the second vehicle in the household. You may also receive the annual permit by mail by sending a copy of the registration along with a check payable to the "Town of Canton" to: Town Clerk, PO Box 168, Collinsville, CT 06022.



Christmas trees may be discarded at the Transfer Station at no charge with proof of residency through January 26, 2013.

#### **POLICE – Medication Drop Box**

Through a collaborative effort between the Canton Police Department, Community of Concern, Youth Services Bureau and the Substance Abuse Council, a grant from Canton Community Health Fund was secured to allow for the purchase and installation of a Medication Collection and Disposal box located at the Canton Police Department. The Medication Collection and Disposal program serves many purposes, two of which are the following:

- 1. The Medication Collection and Disposal box will provide Canton residents with a safe and secure way to dispose of unwanted and unneeded medications. This in turn will reduce access to addictive medications for accidental or intentional misuse by children or others in the home.
- 2. The Medication Collection and Disposal box provides an environmentally safe alternative to disposing of medications in the landfill or sewer systems that may later negatively affect the environment.



The Canton Police Department will provide a steel one-way hopper door type collection box to be secured in its lobby into which citizens may deposit these medications.

- \*The collection box shall be clearly marked for this purpose with instructions for proper use.
- \*The collection box shall be double locked and securely fastened in place to prohibit removal of the box or retrieval of medications from within the box by unauthorized persons
- \*Citizens may place their unused medications/drugs into the collection box anonymously. (Commercial disposal from medical facilities, doctor/dental offices, veterinarians, etc. is prohibited and is not part of this program). Markers will be provided to encourage depositors to obliterate personally identifying information.
- \*Medications should be placed into plastic bags provided at the drop location before depositing items into the drop box. Opened containers of liquid will not be accepted unless they are completely sealed.
- \*Syringes shall not be placed into the drop box. Signage will instruct depositors of alternative methods of disposal.
- \*No medications or other waste shall be permitted to be left outside of the drop box.
- \*The drop box will be available for access 7 days a week, 24 hours a day.

**Senior** / **Social Services** has many types of programs and activities to make your days more interesting, healthful and fun! The Senior Center has many special one-time events. Please call 860.693.5811 to inquire about travel opportunities, special luncheon events, educational presentations, workshops and other resources that may be available to you.

#### Dial-A-Ride

Transportation is available for seniors over 60 and for adults with disabilities, for trips within Canton, MON-FRI, 9:30AM-3:30PM. CALL **860-693-1156**, **between 8AM and 4PM a day ahead, or Friday for a Monday ride.**Annual memberships are required to ride, and cost \$50 per fiscal year or \$25 for January-June, 2013. A ten-ride Punch Pass also can be purchased for \$10. Reduced membership costs are available for lower income persons. Apply at the Senior/Social Services Office.

#### Medical Transportation

Rides to medical appointments are provided by Valley Cab and Yellow Cab to seniors over 60 and adults with disabilities to most areas of CT (beyond Canton.) The cost is covered by grants to the Town, and riders pay a gratuity only. Call Senior/Social Services to request a ride.

#### **Blood Pressure Clinics**

The VNA checks Blood Pressures in the Lower Level Conference Room each Wednesday from 12:00-1:30PM. Monitoring is also offered for the Walking Group on first & third Friday from 9:30-11:30AM. Get checked before and after you walk.

#### **AARP Income Tax Assistance**

Trained tax-preparers will be available to help you file your income tax free of charge, Wednesday mornings beginning Feb. 6, 2013. Call 860.693.5811 for appointments and information on documents needed.

#### **Podiatry/Foot Care Services**

## SOCIAL SERVICES

#### **SOCIAL SERVICES INFORMATION**

Social Services for Canton residents are available in the Senior/Social Services Office in the Canton Community and Senior Center located in the lower level, rear, at 40 Dyer Avenue. The following are some of the main State and Federal and local programs that Canton seniors and adults with disabilities can apply for. There is no charge for any Social Services assistance. Call 860.693.5811 for assistance or information.

#### **Energy Assistance (CHAP or CEAP)**

In the fall and winter, people at certain income and asset levels may be helped to pay for oil or other heat from these two State programs and Operation Fuel.

The <u>Senior/Social Services Office</u> begins taking appointments each October 1<sup>st</sup>. Program is active until the following March.

#### Food Stamp Program

The Food Stamp Program (now called SNAP) provides monthly cash assistance to help low-income households buy groceries. Eligibility for food stamps is based on household income and assets. Call 860.693.5811 for more information. Applications are also taken at Gifts of Love in Avon-call 860.676.2323 for an appointment.

#### **Elderly Property Tax Relief**

Applications for a reduction in homeowner property tax assessments are taken at the <u>Assessor's Office.</u> You must have income under certain limits and there are additional tax reductions for people who are legally blind or a veteran. Applications are taken each year between February 15 and May 15.

#### Renter's Rebate

Renters may qualify for a once-a-year rebate on rent they paid. The filing period is between May and September. You can apply starting September 15<sup>th</sup> at the Assessor's Office.

#### Fuel Bank

Energy Assistance is available through the Canton Fuel Bank to residents experiencing financial hardship and who have an emergency fuel need. Please call 860.693.5811 for additional information.

#### **Canton Food Bank**

The Food Bank, located at 55 River Rd (Trinity Episcopal Church) is open Tuesday mornings, 8:30AM to 11:30AM. Call 860.693.2024 for information, to make a donation or to volunteer. To use the Food Bank, you need to have an ID card, which is provided by the Senior/Social Services staff.

#### **Medicare Savings Program**

The government will provide supplemental insurance and/or refund the Part B Medicare premium for people who meet income limits. It may also help to lower prescription costs for people who have Medicare D prescription coverage. The period to re-evaluate your coverage is October and November each year. Call office for appointment with the CHOICES volunteer.

#### **Connecticut Home Care for Elders Program**

This program can provide assistance (Lifeline, meals on wheels, home health aid, homemaker, adult day care) to help who are unable to care for themselves. Call Senior/Social Services for information.

#### **Medicaid**

Medical assistance is provided by the State to people who are mostly very low income and have minimal assets. There are several types of help available, based on age, income and assets.



#### YOUR LIBRARY CARD


- As a resident of Canton, you are entitled to receive a free Canton Public Library card by filling out a short application.

# RENEWALS

Most items can be renewed once. (Exceptions: items reserved by other patrons, admission passes, Quick Read books, and Wii games) You can renew your items in person, by phone, or online through our website.

#### **RESERVES**

If the item you want is checked out, we can reserve it for you. Ask a staff member at any public service desk. Also, you can place a reserve online through our website (have your library card handy) or by phone.

#### **REQUESTS FOR ITEMS WE DON'T OWN**

If the library doesn't own the item you want, ask us. We may be able to add it to the collection and reserve it for you. Or, we will try to borrow it for you from another library.



Located on East Hill Road, this 40 acre facility is Canton's premier recreation area. Located in the park are four lighted tennis courts, two full basketball courts, skateboard park, picnic pavilions, multi-sport fields, playscape, and a sand volleyball court. The park is also the location of the Olympic sized 50 Meter swimming pool, child's wading pool and pool house. Pool passes are available at the front desk of the pool house in season. The park is host to several summer concerts and special events through the summer.

Canton's Linear park is currently about 2 miles in length from the border of Burlington near the axe factory to Rt 44 and Lovely St. Plans are in progress for continuing the trail North of Rt 44 along Lawton Rd to connect to the Simsbury trail network.



## Bicentennial Park

Located on Old River Rd next the Public Works garage. This field is used by Canton Little League. There is also parking and access to the Farmington River Trail from this park.


# Millennium Fields
